IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any and all petitions for Certificates of Innocence and Certificates of Good Conduct shall be assigned to and heard by the Presiding Judge of the Criminal Division or her designee.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any and all petitions for review of the denial of the issuance of FOID card applications by the Illinois State Police shall be assigned to and heard by the Presiding Judge of the Civil Division or his designee.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall ensure that the case reassignment monitoring system is updated to reflect the above stated assignments for the dates stated and that the judge assignment packets are changed at the earliest possible time to reflect the proper judge name.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all trial and motion dates for cases affected under this Order shall remain as scheduled unless otherwise ordered by Court.
